


## Regional workshop on strengthening telemedicine

Strengthening telemedicine implementation in the WHO South-East Asia (SEA) Region.

In recent years, countries in the SEA Region have shown considerable progress in the implementation of digital health initiatives and in particular Telemedicine services to facilitate the delivery of quality and cost-effective health services to all as an integral step forward towards achieving universal health coverage (UHC) and the health-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Working through various partnerships, WHO projected the fundamental importance of harnessing the power of digital health tools in the <u>Global strategy on digital health 2020–2025</u>, endorsed by the 73<sup>rd</sup> WHA in 2020.

The Global strategy promotes the appropriate and sustainable adoption of digital health technologies within the context of national health strategies and priorities.

Telemedicine is an integral component of the Global strategy strategic objective 4 "advocate people-centered health system that are enabled by digital health such as telemedicine for strengthening service delivery."

## Today's workshop constitutes an introspective time point for the SEA Region countries:

- To assess the current implementations of telemedicine technologies and respective results among the Member States of the SEA Region and to share lessons learnt particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic response
- To identify gaps, challenges, and opportunities in telemedicine that can hinder or facilitate progress towards UHC and the health-related SDGs
- To outline country-specific road maps or action plans aimed at strengthening telemedicine implementations, as a strategic, technical and operational support from WHO and partners to Member States of the SE Asia Region.

The primary outcome this workshop is to support each country to develop a roadmap or action plan that can strengthen telemedicine implementations in the short- and mediumterm.

The workshop offers time and space for dialogue, exchange of knowledge, good practices and lessons learnt to address critical questions around:

- (i) The key telemedicine programme implementations and priorities in each country.
- (ii) The current and foreseeable challenges and risks.
- (iii) The key opportunities for telemedicine in improving service deliver.
- (iv) Consolidating and prioritizing requests for support and investments from WHO and global health development partners?
